



The Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America (LOSNA) has a rich history that dates back to the late 19th century. It emerged as a response to the burgeoning popularity of Freemasonry and its associated fraternal organizations, particularly the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, commonly known as the Shriners.

Founded in 1903, LOSNA was established as an auxiliary organization to the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, which was exclusively for men. The primary aim of LOSNA was to provide a counterpart for the female relatives of Shriners, offering them opportunities for fellowship, philanthropy, and personal growth within a fraternal context.

The idea for the Ladies Oriental Shrine originated in 1901 when Eva Brent, the wife of a Shriner, envisioned a similar organization for women. Working closely with other Shriners' wives and female relatives, she laid the groundwork for what would become LOSNA.

In 1903, at a meeting in Wheeling, West Virginia, the Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America was officially established, with Eva Brent becoming its first High Priestess. The organization quickly gained traction, with chapters (called Courts) established across North America.

LOSNA's structure and rituals were inspired by the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, incorporating elements of Eastern mystique and symbolism. Members of LOSNA engaged in various charitable activities, supporting causes such as hospitals, orphanages, and homes for the elderly.

Over the decades, LOSNA has evolved and adapted to the changing social landscape while remaining true to its core principles of fellowship, philanthropy, and personal development. Today, LOSNA has developed its own distinct identity and legacy, making significant contributions to the communities it serves and is not an auxiliary of Shriners International but a separate and distinct Order.

In addition to its philanthropic endeavors, LOSNA provides a supportive network for its members, fostering friendships and promoting personal growth through its rituals, ceremonies, and educational programs.

Today, the Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America continues to thrive, with chapters throughout the United States and Canada. Its members remain dedicated to the organization's founding principles, ensuring that its rich history and tradition endure for generations to come. We are happy to announce, that starting in March we will have a LOSNA club in our building. LOSNA members will meet the last Tuesday of the month at 7PM. Any ladies, 18 or older who are interested are welcome to come meet with us.





Master Architect Award

A. Ritual Component

- 1. A minimum of 3 members provide 3 different lectures in a tyled lodge, (Lectures are EA, Staircase, MM).
- 2. A member of the Lodge must be able to give the Apron Presentation, 'G'
 Lecture, King Solomon part, and
 Hiram, King of Tyre.
- 3. Lodge must exemplify all 3 Degrees during the awards year with a minimum of 6 parts performed by lodge officers.

B. Masonic Education Component

- 1. A minimum of 3 masonic education programs are held by the lodge (other than at a Stated Meeting, may be at lodge or virtual).
- 2. Lodge must have a masonic education presentation before, during, or after a minimum of 6 Stated meetings.

C. Lodge Operations Component


- 1. Lodge hosts a tyled meeting with another Masonic Lodge.
- 2. Lodge issues a newsletter a minimum of 8 times during the year with submission to Grand Lodge for Trestleboard recognition.
- 3. Lodge must have a website that is updated monthly with submission to the Grand Lodge for recognition.
- Lodge hosts an informational session open to the general public.
- Lodge has a program to contact nonattending members and members in jeopardy of Suspension for NPD.


- 6. Lodge shows an annual increase of GrandView portal users by 5%.
- 7. Lodge has a Masonic Funeral Team (WM, SW, JW, Chap) and conducts a minimum of 1 practice or funeral ceremony.
- 8. Lodge has a Long-Range Planning committee that meets a minimum of once every 3 months. The committee must have established goals and objectives.
- 9. Lodge has a membership recognition program (Mason of the Year, with lodge winners submitted to Grand Lodge for statewide recognition).


D. Lodge Representation Component


- 1. At least 2 Lodge Officers attend the Grand Lodge Education Conference (Masonicon Arizona).
- 2. At least 3 members of the Lodge attend the 2024 Grand Lodge Communication (2 must be the WM, SW, and/or JW).
- 3. At least 4 members of the lodge attend a meeting of a Masonic Youth Group (where possible) or an Eastern Star or Amaranth open event (2 must be the WM, SW, and/or JW).
- 4. Lodge must be active in a recognized Local community activity.
- 5. Lodge attends a minimum of 2 other Masonic Lodge's meetings (stated or called) with a minimum of 6 members attending (2 must be the WM, SW, and/or JW).
- 6. Lodge has a program for Bikes for Books, CHIPS, Public Schools Essay contest, recognition of community organizations and or individuals First responders, schools and teachers.
- 7. Lodge must host a fund-raising activity for a Masonic Youth Group (or a recognized local youth group if there is no local Masonic Youth Group in the community). This cannot be substituted for the local activity noted above.
- 8. A minimum of 4 Master Masons (2 are non-Lodge Officers) attend a Lodge of Instruction (LOI) conducted by/under the auspices of the Grand Lecturer.
